RECIPE From Marilouise Barnhill

Cucumber Lime Mold

1 package lime-flavored gelatin 3/4 cup hot water 2 packages (3 oz. each) cream cheese, softened 1 cup salad dressing 1 teaspoon prepared horseradish 1/4 teaspoon salt 2 tablespoons lemon juice 3/4 cup diced cucumber 1/4 cup minced onion Dissolve gelatin in hot water. Add cream cheese, salad dressing, horseradish and salt. Beat until smooth. Blend in lemon juice. Chill until consistency of unbeaten egg white. Stir in cucumber and onion. Turn into 3-cup mold or individual molds. Chill until set. Unmold on salad greens. Garnish with slices of unpeeled cucumber and thinly sliced radishes, if desired. Or, serve with chunks of chilled tuna, salmon or crab meat in center of ring mold. Yield: 4 portions

SAFETY TIPS

Tell your spouse, your children, your neighbors, your parents, your doctor's office, cashiers at the market, everyone you run across. Put your car keys beside your bed at night.

If you hear a noise outside your home or someone trying to get in your house, just press the Panic button on the key fob for your car. It will set off the alarm. The horn will continue to sound until either you turn it off or the battery dies.

This tip came from a neighborhood watch coordinator. Next time you come home for the night and start to put your keys away, think of this. It is a security alarm system that you probably already have and requires no installation.

Test it. It will go off from most everywhere inside your house. The honking will keep up until your battery runs down or until you reset it with a button on the key fob. It works if you park in your driveway or garage.

If your car alarm goes off when someone is trying to break into your house, odds are that person will not stick around. After a few seconds all the neighbors will be looking out their windows to see who is out there. The criminal does not want that. Remember to carry your keys while walking to your car in a parking lot. The alarm can work the same way there. This is something that should be shared with everyone. It might save a life or a sexual abuse crime.

P.S. It also would useful for any emergency, such as a heart attack, when you can not reach a telephone.
